The New Hampshire Kinship Navigator Program can help.

Kinship Navigators link grandparents and other relative caregivers to a broad range of services and supports that meet the needs of both children and caregiver.

In partnership with NH Family Resource Centers (FRCs), the Kinship Navigator Program provides free, confidential services throughout New Hampshire.

Services are community-based and easy to access through the FRC nearest you.



Family Support New Hampshire acts to bring together the diverse leadership from existing and newly forming family resource centers and family support programs within New Hampshire under the common vision of establishing a statewide network of family support practice within New Hampshire.

New Hampshire grandparent and relative caregivers play a critical role in the prevention of unnecessary entries into foster care.

Despite the crucial role they play, these kinship caregivers often encounter significant challenges in their newfound role.

Kinship Navigators can help.

What do Kinship Navigators do?

They help kinship caregivers understand various community supports and services specific to their family's needs.

They help kinship caregivers access supports by guiding families through benefits & eligibility applications.

They provide emotional support to kinship caregivers in times of need.

They serve as an advocate for both kinship caregivers and children as they navigate a complex network of programs and benefits.
